Cellulitis ICD-10-CM Coding

Cellulitis is a common, non-contagious bacterial skin infection, usually caused by the streptococcus and staphylococcus

Cellulitis with acute lymphangitis	First code cellulitis, then infection (B95-B97)
Cellulitis with abscess	First code cellulitis, then infection (B95-B97)
Cellulitis with open wound	First code open wound, then cellulitis, then infection (B95-B97)
Cellulitis with superficial injury	First code injury, then cellulitis. Note: Circumstances of admission will determine the sequencing
Cellulitis with burb	Code both, Note: Circumstances of admission will determine the sequencing
Cellulitis with frostbite	Code both. Note: Circumstances of admission will determine the sequencing
Cellulitis with gangrene	List code for gangrene (196)
Cellulitis and diabetes	Query provider for any link between 2 conditions

Example: Diabetes Type II and Cellulitis of Lower Left Leg

• If the provider does make the link that cellulitis is due to diabetes:

Code: E11.628 type 2 diabetes mellitus with other skin complications; L03.116 cellulitis of left lower limb

• If the provider does not make the link that cellulitis is due to diabetes:

Code: E11.9 type 2 diabetes mellitus; L03.116 cellulitis of left lower limb

NOTE:

Cellulitis and *acute lymphangitis* are reported with the same subcategory of codes in ICD-10-CM.

Lymphangitis is an infection of the lymph vessels

Dermatitis is inflammation of the skin.

Eczema refers to various skin inflammations
